His highly individual music comes with memorable tunes, striking lyrics and compelling rhythms, and his band consists some of the UK's top roots musicians.</p>  |
| <p>16.00 <b>Debbie Bond</b></p> <p>Direct from Alabama and appearing as part of her 2016 UK tour, Debbie Bond has been 30 years in the music business, cutting her teeth with the likes of Johnny Shines, Eddie Kirkland and Willie King. Expect a mix of rocking covers as well as searing originals from Debbie and her fantastic band with 'Radiator' Rick Asherson (keys) and the amazing Mickey Barker on drums.</p> | <p>17.00 <b>Low Down Dogs</b></p> <p>A discerning band of musicians, the Low Down Dogs have considerable pedigree in the blues and feature the sublime vocals, slide guitar and harmonica work of 'Mad Dog' Dave Barnes, along with John Crowther's vocals, and top drawer guitar and mandolin skills. The rhythm section sees Dave Thomas on bass, guitar and vocals and Pete Abernethy on drums, percussion and backing vocals. With special guest Chrissie Thomas.</p> |

| <p>18.00 <b>Son of Dave</b></p> <p>Son of Dave isn't your average blues musician. This one-man harmonica &amp; beat-box genius beats his own path, turning rhythm and blues upside down. It takes some kind of genius with just harmonica, beatbox, percussion and a loopstation to support artists as diverse as Iggy and The Stooges, Grace Jones, Heavy Trash, Supergrass and the Yardbirds. With a briefcase full of naughty tricks, Son of Dave promises a show not to be missed.</p>    | <p>19.00 <b>Grapevine Blues</b></p> <p>Grapevine Blues is by definition a blues band, though their repertoire has expanded over the years to include jazz, funk, and rock and roll. Grapevine have been repeatedly featured on radio programmes such as Paul Jones' 'Jazz me Blues' on Jazz F.M. &amp; 'The Voice of America' plus many other radio stations in countries around the world. Guaranteed to get you up on your feet dancing!</p> |
| <p>20.00 <b>Red Butler</b></p> <p>Recently back from representing the UK at the European Blues Challenge, Red Butler are a young band on a mission to entertain and play great blues. The band's established line-up consists of Alex Butler (bass) Charlie Simpson (drums), Jane Pearce (vocals) and Mike Topp (bass), drawing upon influences from Etta James, King King, Santana and Derek Trucks.</p>   | <p>21.00 <b>Boom la Tete</b></p> <p>Expect a mix of blues, gypsy swing and rock 'n' roll. High energy music that never fails to bring everyone to their feet! Outstanding musicianship and incredible energy from charismatic frontmen Stephane Bourquin on guitar and vocals, and Crispin Forster on Sax and Clarinet. A fabulous way to close the Black Barn and guaranteed crowd-pleasers!</p>  |
